**ARE YOU IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING REGULATIONS?**

Section 382 of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations provides regulations for controlled substances and alcohol use and testing.

**WHO MUST BE TESTED?**

Any driver who has a CDL and operates the following:

- \* Vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,001 or more pounds.
- \* Vehicles with a gross combination weight rating of 26,001 or more pounds, inclusive of a towed unit with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds.
- \* Passenger vehicles designed to transport 16 or more passengers including the driver.
- \* Vehicles transporting hazardous materials that require placarding.
